Support for the vulnerable

If you are vulnerable because of your age, disability, you care for a disabled child, you're pregnant or have other health conditions and your friends and family cannot help you with shopping, you can contact the council to request support.

The council will send you an emergency food parcel. This emergency food parcel should see you through a few days.

Meanwhile, we will ask a local volunteer scheme to contact you and arrange to assist you with your weekly shopping going forward, until such a time as you can shop for yourself.
